Class 1 have been learning all about instructions in their English lessons. We have first practiced following instructions to make a gruffalo crumble before trying to write our own using 'bossy words'. In art we have been practicing painting and learning all about colour. We have found out all about primary colours and how to use them to make secondary colours. In our



most recent lesson we learned about hues and how we can change how light or dark a colour is. We practiced this by using blue and yellow to make different hues of green. #### Class Two News

Class 2 have had another busy week. We have done a lot more great work about the Anglo-Saxons and we have been time detectives to find out all about ancient artifacts that were discovered at Sutton Hoo. In English we have been looking at journalistic writing and we are going to tie this in with our class book by writing stories for the Narnia Times. In maths we have done a lot of work on time-telling and as part of Science Week we have done a special experiment on the dunkability

of biscuits. We have continued to learn about animal vocabulary in Spanish and we have used our knowledge of colours to draw and label our own special pets. Our DT textiles project is going very well and our pencil cases are starting to take shape. Everyone really enjoyed World Book Day - as well as dressing



up, we did lots of activities around our favourite authors and genres, and it was great to spend some time thinking about why books are so important to us.





#### **Class Three News**

Class 3 have been busy learning about the Maya - they have looked at similarities and differences between Maya and Anglo-Saxon houses and how important gods and goddesses were in this ancient civilisation. Our class book, Curse of the Maya is also inspiring the writing in class and pupils have written some powerful setting descriptions in English. Year 6 pupils have visited Chyvarhas Care Home recently and the whole class will be reading to the older generation in the village at the coffee morning in the last week of term.
